The Pupil Premium Grant is government funding available to schools for any eligible pupils.

Am I too short to become a firefighter?

There is no minimum height requirement to become a firefighter.

Do I need to sleep on station?

No. On-call staff have a pager that alerts them when a call comes in. You will then respond to station within five minutes. The majority of the time you will continue to

Could this help me to become a full time firefighter?

Last year we offered 43 full time positions to on-call staff. This will continue.

If I have to work out of town or take the kids to school, how do I do this?

At this station contracts range from 30 - 120 hours per week, you are only required to be immediately available during the hours you agree with us.

How much could I earn as an on-call firefighter?

Jane is a single parent providing 38 hours per week during the day earning £7,279 a year.



Dave works shifts while providing 96 hours per week split between days and nights earning £14,187 a year
