#### WORLD BOOK DAY – celebrated at St. Ben's on FRIDAY 8th MARCH

On Friday 8th March 2024, we will be celebrating World Book Day. The theme this year will be 'vocabulary'. We would like your children to dress up as a 'word'. For example, your child may dress up as 'dazzling' and wear sparkly clothing. They may wear pyjamas and be 'sleepy' or 'fatigued'. They could be 'petrifying' and dress up as a witch. The more ambitious the vocabulary the better!

Please ensure your child has a placard or sticker with their word displayed on their costume. If your child would like to dress up as a traditional book character this is also fine; they should write an adjective (describing word) to describe that character on their placard. For example, if they dressed up as Iron Man they might choose to be the word 'brave' or 'courageous'. For Cinderella, they may choose to be 'magical' or 'resilient'. You could choose a pirate costume for 'treacherous' or a soldier outfit for 'fortitude'.

If you google 'Vocabulary Parade' there are lots of other examples. Please see some examples below:
