Their opening game saw a tough match vs Walton, in which they triumphed 3-0, with goals from Morrison (2) and an audacious lob from Baulch. In the next game, St. Ben's took an early lead against Brookside but then had to defend hard as their opponents fought back. Goalkeeper, Ely, and defenders Sander-Jackson and Drake-Scott were on hand to stand firm in the face of Brookside pressure, but they finally broke through, scoring two goals to inflict a narrow loss on St. Ben's. In their final match, St. Ben's let loose, scoring 7 goals against Ashcott (Zharuk, Hopkins x 2, Morrison x 3 and Baulch) before Ashcott scored a late consolation goal. Debutants Gray-Andrews, Rahn and Person provided energy to the St. Ben's midfield throughout.

St. Ben's now go into match day 2 in November full of confidence. Well done to the whole team who were magnificent and thank you to Mr Lintell and Mr Ranger for coaching them and transporting the team.
