

Science

As scientists, we will be applying our understanding of the laws of electricity will enable us to design and create our own circuits, incorporating different components to conduct different functions. A series of challenging investigations will give the pupils opportunities to coordinate and carry out their own detailed scientific enquiries.

In the second half term, we will be learning all about light. This will include learning about our eyes, reflection, refraction, spectrum and seeing colours. Our topic will end with a puppet theatre.

Art and Design

As artists, we will be looking at different representations of the London skyline. We will create our own representations of the London Skyline using mixed media.

Design and Technology

In design and technology, we will design and make our own periscopes linked to our science topic of light.

RE

The central theme in RE this term is the importance of salvation in Christianity, linking to the festival of Easter. We will also be considering the lives of inspirational figures. David our vicar will visit to answer our own questions about faith.

Music

In music we will be learn to play a selection of well-known songs on the glockenspiel. We will also work in groups to compose our own pieces.

English

We will start our term by studying the text 'The day the crayons quit'. We will write letters in response to the letters written by the crayons and we will write our own letters from other items from within the classroom.

After our visit to London, we will write a detailed recount to share our experiences.

Linking to our London topic, we will be looking at democracy. We will discuss how parliament works and from this role play parliament and carry out our own debates. We will write balance arguments and persuasive pieces linking to topics we feel passionate about.

Maths

During the spring term, we will continue to extend our knowledge of fractions and their relationship to decimals and percentages. We will also learn about ratio and algebra.

History

As historians, we will look at the history of democracy, starting with Greek Democracy and then looking at the current system. This will include the Suffragette movement and the rights for women.

Geography

We will look at the social and physical changes between Glastonbury in 1904 and 2020. We will then compare Glastonbury to London in 2020. What are the similarities and differences?

PE

We will be following the 'Real PE' curriculum which will focus on Co-ordination, Ball Skills and Balance. This will allow the children to focus on the key skills needed to be a wholesome athlete.

Computing

During the spring term, we will use Scratch to create, evaluate and improve our own times tables games. These will be made for our year 4 children so they can play them to practise ahead of their multiplication check.

Wellbeing

In the lead up to SATs, we will talk about the importance of sleep, a healthy diet and the need for relaxation techniques so that we do not become overwhelmed.
