COVID UPDATE

Thank you all for your support this week. We remain in Amber measures for the next week after which Public Health Somerset will review the situation and we will update you. If we remain in Amber measures beyond next Friday, we will be unable to undertake any trips, which will affect Year 4's scheduled trips to Caerleon – we will update you as soon as we know more, but please be assured that we will provide you a full refund if this is the case. There will also be no swimming next week.

While we remain in Amber measures, please continue to do the following:

At the first sign of any symptoms in your child (including cold symptoms and stomach pains) please isolate them and order a PCR test. They may return to school if their PCR result is negative.

Please ensure that you adhere to the period of isolation advised when you receive a positive test – it has come to my attention that some pupils attended Hallowe'en events and activities even though they had been advised to isolate – this kind of selfish behaviour will mean the virus spreading and us remaining in Amber measures for longer.

Please continue to wear face masks when on school premises and remember that we are not allowing parents and carers in the school building for the time being, but that doesn't mean we don't want to hear from you – please contact us via the phone or a Class Dojo post!

Once again, thank you for your understanding and your support of our hardworking and dedicated team.


If we don't hear from you in the next week or so, we will contact you.

Book Review: The Midnight Guardians by Ross Montgomery Reviewed by Lucas in Year 6
