COVID UPDATE

We remain in Amber Measures so our safety measures, including staggered starts and using both entrances, remain in place.

The most recent guidance is as follows:

Since Wed 22nd December, the 10 day selfisolation period for people who record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced to 7 days in most circumstances, unless you cannot test for any reason.

Individuals may now take LFD tests on Day 6 and Day 7 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than Day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. This also applies to children under 5, with LFD testing at parental or guardian discretion. If both these tests are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result.

Please use the dedicated NHS website for support and advice. As a school we cannot advise on when an isolation period should finish.
