


Back at school, pupils and staff created a moving display outside the office to show their respect to the fallen and pupils, and staff joined together at midday to commemorate the day.

We hope you've all had a good half-term break, it's the time of year when there are lots of infections about but there's lot you can do to help keep your children as healthy as they can be.

- The annual school flu immunisation programme takes place between Oct & Dec co-ordinated by the School Age Immunisation Team (SAINT) at Somerset NHS Foundation Trust, please consider agreeing for your child to take part. <u>Tel:</u> 0300 323 0032.
- To minimise the spread of seasonal bugs, think 'Catch it, Kill it, Bin it' for sneezes and keep up with regular handwashing.
- Please support School manage covid local outbreaks by observing any changes put in place, they're there to keep us all safe.

Pupil Voice... This week's topic is Remembrance Day





The 11th of November is Remembrance Day, when we commemorate people who died in the wars. Usually, people commemorate by wearing red poppies, flowers that grew in fields in France in the World Wars. The Royal Legion Poppy Appeal started in 1921, a few years after World War I ended.

Our school sold a range of poppy related items for the pupils to buy. The products included: Rulers, Snap bands, Illustrated rubbers, Rubber bracelets, Reflectors, Pencil sharpeners and a range of other things. And of course the poppies themselves (paper ones).

On the 11th of November at 11:00 in the morning, the whole of year six went up to St John's church for a 2-minute silence outside the church to respect the people who sacrificed themselves for our freedom.

Here's what the adults thought:

"The children were amazingly respectful during the 2-minute silence." Mrs Allen, TA.

"I'm incredibly proud of how respectful our Year 6 pupils were and I am so glad they were invited to take part because I think it is really important for them to understand the importance of Remembrance Day" Mr Ranger
