# CHANGES TO DROP OFF AND COLLECTION

A letter went home on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup>
February regarding the easing of measures at school after half term.
Please ensure you read this carefully as there will be changes to the start and end of the day, especially for Years 3 and 4. The main changes are:

#### **Before School:**

 All pupils to start school at 8:45am; playground will be open to pupils from 8:30am.

#### **After School Collection:**

- Gates open at 3:05 for parents of Year 3 and 4 pupils to come onto playground
- 3:10pm Year 3 and 4 line up on playground for parents to collect them.
- Year 5 exit through back gate at 3:15pm,
- Year 6 exit through front of school at 3:15pm.

We are hoping this will alleviate some of the pressure on the back gate at the end of school.

As ever, we would recommend that parents walk/ride to school to avoid the issues of parking and pollution at the back gate. Please let us know your thoughts on the new system.
