COVID RESTRICTIONS

EASE

This week has seen the easing of Covid restrictions which has felt wonderful. We hope that everyone is growing used to the new drop off and collection system. While I appreciate that it is not easy for all parents and carers of Year 3 and 4 pupils to come down onto the playground, we think it is keeping the children much safer as it makes it far easier to monitor the back gate. In school, staff are no longer wearing masks and we returned to upper school and lower school collective worship in the Hall, which was superb (please see the feature below right).

While this all feels great, we must remember that if we experience significant Covid numbers, we may run the risk of having to return to safety measures. With this in mind, we would encourage you to keep your child off school if they have any of the symptoms of Covid. If they test positive on a Lateral Flow Test, they can come back to school if they test negative on Day 5 and Day 6 after the original test.
